September Club Meeting – Saturday the 26th

First, I'll be going to Clayton, NY on 9-19-15 for the Vintage & Classic Street Meet with registration at the Knights of Columbus hall on 460 James Street beginning at 9:30 AM. Last year we cruised there and had to park on a side street, we got there after 10 AM and the show is drawing more cars.

This year the show will be on Mary Street, in front of the Antique Boat Museum, not downtown Clayton. Mary Street is shorter than Riverside Drive, so I'm driving my Tiger to get to Clayton about 9 AM. I hope they close off the whole street and have more parking on the Museum's lots. Registration is 9:30 to 11:30; Judging is 12-2 PM; Car Show Award Ceremony is at 2:30 PM; and the parade of cars around the village is at 3 PM.

Sunday the 20th the show moves to Graves Street with the cruise-in starting at 9 AM; Sixty-foot time trials at 10 AM; Exhaust Wars Competition at 11:30 AM; Timed Burn-Out Contest at 12:30 PM; May Pop Burn-Out Contest at 1:30 PM.; and awards at 3:00 PM.

Saturday, September 26th is the 12th Annual SUNY Canton Auto Club Cruise-In. This is part of the Family and Community Weekend with the Cruise-In from 11 AM – 3 PM; hot dogs and soda available; 50/50 and door prizes; Brandon Baldwin will have dyno runs in the Aut Lab, call him at 265-2717 to sign up for a dyno run.

We'll have a club meeting at 2 PM at the SUNY Canton Cruise-In to talk about upcoming events for the rest of this year.

What is Article 7?

Or a newsletter assistant to help find content, including gathering it from other members, would be greatly appreciated. And we still need a Membership Chairperson – I have been covering that position since last year but would really like to have someone take over, or be a co-chair maybe? If you don't feel quite up to taking on a position solo, maybe there is another member who feels the same and together the two could share a position?

Officers are covered in Articles 5 and 6 of the *Articles and By-Laws of the Seaway Cruisers Classic Car Club, Inc.*, but what is Article 7?

Article 7:

COMMITTEES: *The Committees of the Seaway Cruisers may include: A Cruise Committee, a Membership Committee, and Seaway Festival Car Show Committee. In addition there may be appointed by the President the following:*

Historian: The Historian shall keep a photo album of the Seaway Cruisers members' vehicles, which is to be kept up to date. The historian shall be responsible for obtaining and receiving these photos, to his/her best efforts.

Entertainment and Events Committee: The E and E Committee shall plan events for all members in good standing of the Seaway Cruisers. If the need be, the committee can designate other members to help with an event.

Publicity Chairperson: The Publicity Chairperson is responsible for advertising meetings, community events, and car shows through the local newspapers, radio stations, and other necessary means. If the need be the chairperson can designate other members to help with this duty.

Car Show Chairperson: The Car Show Chairperson shall arrange the Seaway Festival Car Show, or any additional shows, that the Seaway Cruisers will provide for the area, with the assistance of additional members added to the Committee. The Car Show Committee will consist of at least four (4) interested members for the core of the Committee, with other members helping with the planning of the event.

Additional committees will be established if needed.
