

For any car club, "going national" means recognition and publicity



### Your Car's New CID

If you'd modified your engine's bore or stroke, you've got a new CID (cubic inch displacement) - namely, your engine is "bigger" than it used to be. If you'd like to calculate your engine's new size, use the formula below:

#### 8-cylinder engines

Stroke x Bore x Bore x 6.2832

#### 6-cylinder engines

Stroke x Bore x Bore x 4.7124

For example, a 350 Chevy engine has a stroke of 3.48 and a bore of 4:  $3.48 \times 4 \times 4 \times 6.2832 = 349.8486$

Vendor spaces for this show are as follows: Outdoor 15'x30', \$30.00; Indoor 10'x10', \$40.00; Outdoor corral, \$20.00; Indoor corral, \$40.00; electric, \$10.00; public overnight camping, \$10.00. Vendors get a free party Saturday night, T-shirt, camping overnight and tickets on giveaways.
